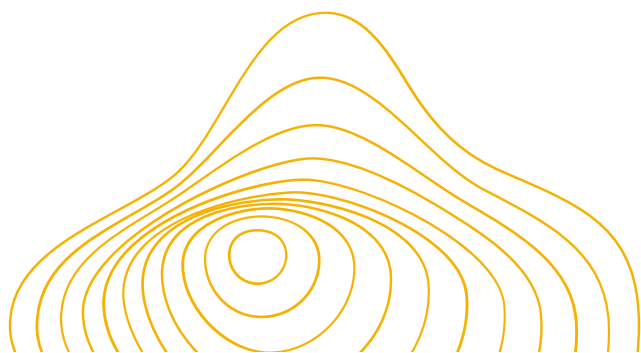
CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care (Digital Delivery)

Online Delivery

- CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care focuses on the knowledge and skills required of early childhood educators who are responsible for maintaining healthy, safe and caring environments for children and for designing and implementing curriculum in early childhood education and care services.

Training Delivery

This course combines self-paced, online delivery with 180 hours of work placement in an accredited Early Childhood Education and Care centre. Students will be supported throughout their study with access to Career Ready's team of high experienced trainers, assessors and support staff.

Access to the digital delivery will be valid for one year, starting on the date of purchase. After this, if the course is not complete, repurchase will be necessary.

Entry Requirements

Entry into this course requires successful completion of Australian Year 10 or equivalent, OR, relevant work experience in a related field.

Other requirements

Students must obtain a Working with Children Check (WWCC) prior to commencing work placement. In some cases, your work placement employers may also ask students to obtain a Australia Federal Police Clearance.

Fees

- Upfront Payment: \$1200
- Instalment Payment: \$1699 (4 instalments of \$424)

HLTAID012 Provide First Aid in an Education and Care Setting

HLTAID012 Provide First Aid in an Education and Care Setting describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to infants and children in line with first aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national peak clinical bodies.

This unit applies to a range of workers within an education and care setting including early childhood workers and educators who work with school age children in outside school hours care and vacation programs.



CHCPRT001 Identify and Respond to Children and Young People at Risk

CHCPRT001 Identify and Respond to Children and Young People at Risk describes the skills and knowledge required to support and protect children and young people who are at risk of harm. This work occurs within legislative and policy frameworks and carries a duty of care responsibility.

This unit applies to workers in a range of job roles providing services to children and young people in community services, education and health contexts.

Professional Development

Introduction to Early Childhood Education and Care

20 hr non-accredited course – digital delivery with 2 hr sessions. This course gives you an introduction to the ECEC sector.

Children's Yoga

Children's Yoga will support educators in ECEC to engage with yoga stories and practice with children ages two to five years.

Children's Breathing Techniques

Children's Breathing Techniques will support educators in ECEC to teach breathwork practices to children.

Ethics and the Early Childhood Education Professional

This course helps to inform the teaching practices of ECEC educators around ethics and ethical action. How do we connect children with ethical thinking and ethical action?

Rights of the Child in Early Childhood Education and Care

Embedding the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child in ECEC into educator and family understandings.

Quality and Innovative Digital Documentation

This course teaches quality and innovation in digital documentation that includes children in the process of documenting their learning and development.

Music and Movement in Early Childhood Education and Care

This course is based around the understanding and promoting of the holistic benefits of music and movement in ECEC.
